



POLICY PRIORITY Provide Medicaid Access to Assisted Living in Pennsylvania

What is Assisted Living?

A home and community-based service setting that provides food, shelter, personal care, assistance or 24-hour supervision and supplemental health care services for a period exceeding 24 hours to seniors who require assistance or supervision in daily activities and desire to age in place.

Personal Care & Daily Activity Support

Assistance with bathing, dressing, grooming, and medication management.

Supervision & Safety

7-day support available to ensure comfort in a homelike setting.

Independence & Quality of Life

Maintaining independence while providing individuals with the care they need.

Social Stimulation

An environment focused on well-being that encourages social engagement.

Costly Impact of Social Isolation

Seniors living alone face higher healthcare costs than those receiving assisted living support. Providing care in assisted living could help prevent these costly outcomes.¹

Medicare spends \$134 more per month (\$1,608 per year), compared with those who are socially engaged.²




